HOW IS STEP FUNDED?

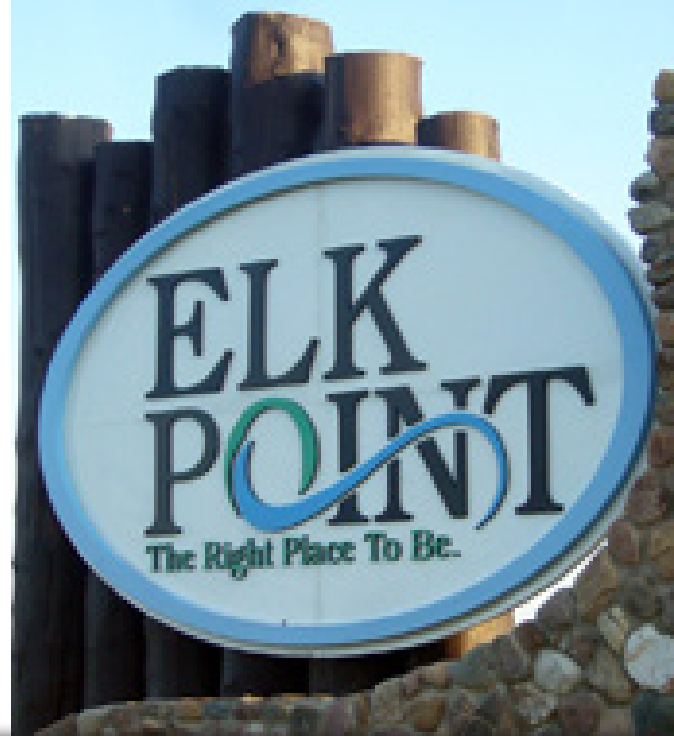
